Natural gas main relocation

Dear Neighbor,

Beginning **early November**, a natural gas contractor for Puget Sound Energy will begin relocating the natural gas pipeline along Alaskan Way from Madison to Pike Streets. The work is required by and in coordination with the Seattle Seawall project.

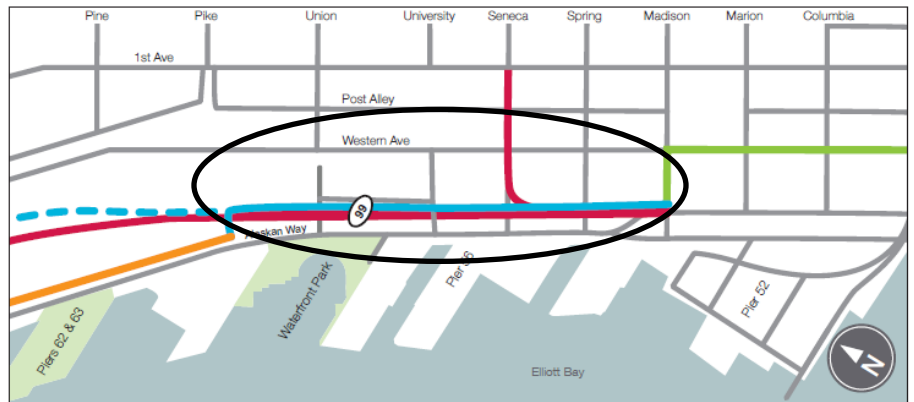
What to expect

- Work is scheduled to begin the evening of November 1 and continue into early next year.
- Construction will take place along Alaskan Way South from Madison to Pike Streets. (see map)
- Work will take place mainly at night Sundays through Fridays.
- Activities include saw-cutting, jack hammering, open trenching, and installation and testing of new pipe; restoration includes trench backfilling and roadway repaving.

Traffic impacts

- Drivers can expect intermittent lane closures and parking restrictions; signs and flaggers will help direct drivers around the construction zone.
- Pedestrian and cyclist access will be rerouted around the work zone; signs and flaggers will help direct.
- Everyone must use caution when traveling in and around the construction zone.

Work hours, schedule and construction activities may vary; some work activities may be weather dependent.
