

It pays to be energy flexible with PSE Flex

If your home gets electricity from PSE, our Flex programs let you earn money for adjusting your usage during high-demand times called Flex events. And if you have smart devices in your home, it's even easier!



Flex Smart

Your smart thermostat will automatically adjust a few degrees during Flex events.

 Get up to a \$50 gift card per device you sign up, plus up to \$40 per device each year.



Flex Batteries

Your home battery storage system will be called upon during Flex events instead of drawing electricity from the grid.

• Get up to \$1,000 per battery for signing up, plus up to \$500 per battery each year.



Flex EV

Your electric vehicle's charging will automatically pause during Flex events.

 Get a \$50 gift card for signing up and \$0.50 per kWh you save during Flex events.



Flex Water Heaters

Your water heater will use its stored hot water during Flex events, instead of turning on the heating element. You may be eligible to receive a free device to make your heater connectable.

A line on the ground could be live-stay away!

As winter weather approaches, be aware of fallen wires. Power lines look like any other type of wire but can be deadly if you get too close. Assume any line on the ground is energized and stay at least 35 feet away (the length of a school bus). Never drive over or under a downed power line. If you see one, call PSE or 911 immediately.

Outside sewer blockage? Call PSE before clearing.

If your sewer is blocked beyond your home's walls, call PSE when your plumber is on the way—or have your plumber call. Some natural gas lines have inadvertently been installed through sewer or septic lines. Using cutting tools could rupture the gas line, causing a dangerous leak. PSE will meet your plumber on-sitefor free-to ensure it's safe to clear.

2025 Renewable Energy Report Card

From the renewable energy generated at Puget Sound Energy-owned wind and hydro power facilities as well as what is purchased from independent power producers, we are on track to meet and exceed the required 15 percent renewable energy target by year-end 2025. The target is based on the average amount of electricity PSE customers used in the prior two years. The costs associated with the generated renewable energy and renewable energy credits were \$43.17 million per year at the time of acquisition and \$24.32 million for the qualifying renewable resource mix anticipated to be used in 2025.

The report card below is a requirement of Washington State's Energy Independence Act passed in 2006. PSE is also working towards complying with the Clean Energy Transformation Act (CETA) passed in 2019, which requires us to achieve 100% clean electricity by 2045.
