## How to smell, hear and see a natural gas leak


You can usually detect natural gas from an odor of sulfur or rotten eggs. But there are other tell-tale signs, especially outdoors: bubbles escaping through a puddle, dead vegetation where you wouldn't expect it, and dirt blowing up from the ground. Natural gas is lighter than air and will rise, and can be ignited by the spark from flipping a light switch. If you detect gas, don't hesitate! Even if you're unsure, leave the area, then call PSE at **1-888-225-5773**, TTY: **1-800-962-9498**, or call **911**.

## Contractors pay dearly for digging without calling 811

Contractors who dig without calling 811 are feeling pain in their pocketbooks. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has levied fines totaling more than \$100,000 against contractors who damaged natural gas lines because they didn't call 811. One was fined \$15,000 for repeated violations; another was fined \$10,000. So be safe and be smart: Call 811 two business days before you plan to dig!
