Re: State highway pole-relocation program

State highway **POLE-RELOCATION PROGRAM** ▶▶▶

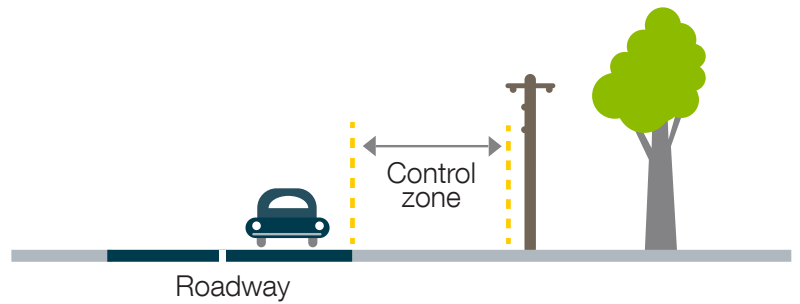
Puget Sound Energy is working to improve public safety and electric reliability by relocating power poles farther away from state roadways. This effort is part of the state of Washington's Strategic Highway Safety Plan, established in 2013, which focuses on decreasing traffic fatalities and injuries.

The Washington State Department of Transportation has established the highway "control zone"—an area adjacent to the roadway that should be free of obstructions to decrease the likelihood of cars coming into contact with objects in the area (see graphic other side).



As part of this effort, PSE will begin working towards pole relocation along Highway 544 (see map below) starting in 2017. Actual relocation of the wood poles will not occur until 2018. This project also includes the installation of tree wire, resulting in greater reliability for the system.

In some locations, we may need to obtain easements from private property owners to relocate poles outside of the control zone. **If an easement is needed on your property, a PSE real estate representative will reach out to you soon.**

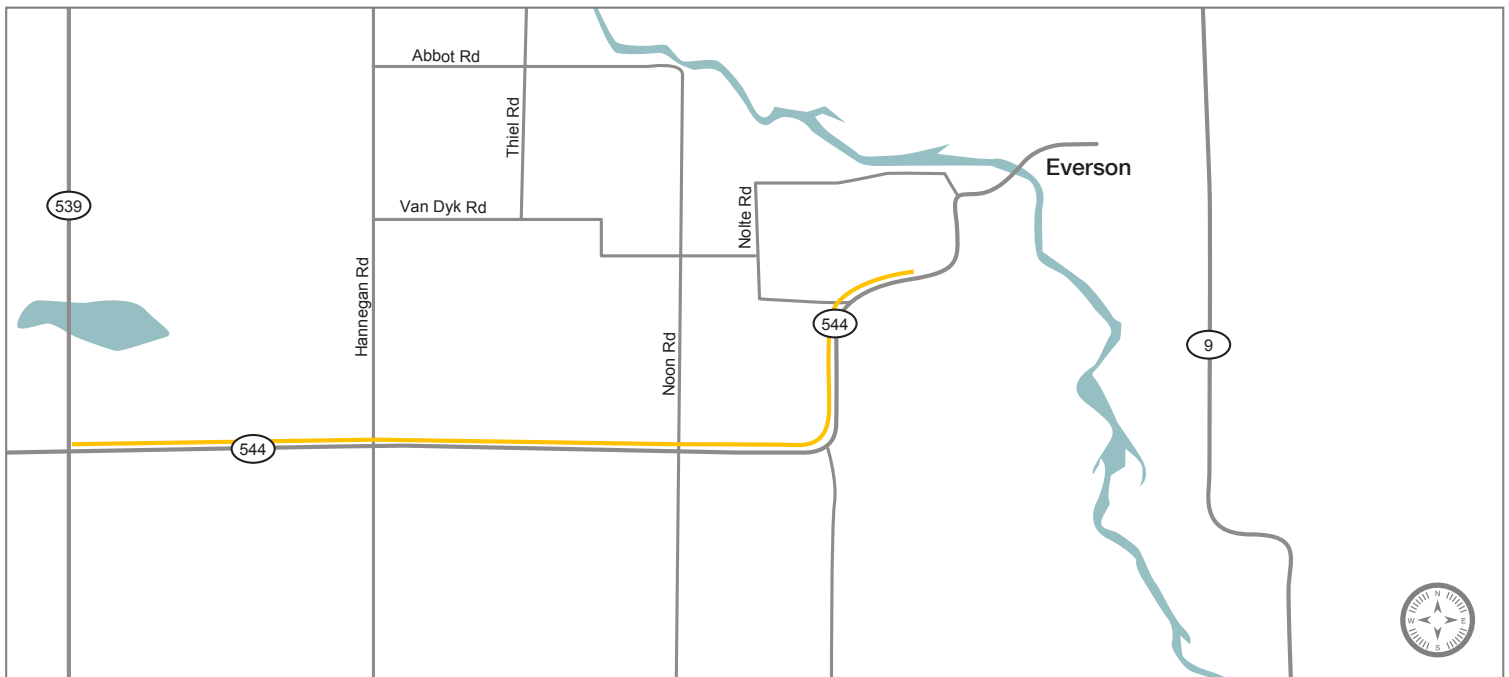
