Re: State highway pole relocation program


state highway pole relocation program

Puget Sound Energy is working to improve public safety and electric reliability by relocating power poles farther away from state roadways. This effort is part of Washington State's Strategic Highway Safety Plan, established in 2013, which focuses on decreasing traffic fatalities and injuries.

The Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) has established the highway "control zone"—an area adjacent to the roadway that should be free of obstructions to decrease the likelihood of cars coming into contact with objects in the area (see graphic other side).

As part of this effort, PSE will be working to relocate poles along State Route 9. In the coming weeks you will see our surveyors along the pole relocation zone (please see map). We anticipate construction on this project to begin in late 2020 or early 2021.

In some locations, we may need to purchase easements from private property owners to relocate poles outside of the control zone. If an easement is needed on your property, a PSE real estate representative will reach out to you directly.


