

Open houses on preferred transmission line route

Puget Sound Energy invites you to an open house to learn about the preliminary preferred route for the Sammamish-Juanita 115 kV transmission line project in your area and provide your comments.

For the past 10 months, a stakeholder advisory group comprised of local government, community and business representatives has worked to help PSE select a preferred route for the new transmission line. PSE hopes to gather public feedback on the advisory group's recommended preferred route and expects to make a final route decision in late summer.

The new 115 kilovolt transmission line will increase electric system capacity and reliability – decreasing the risk of power outages for you and your neighbors.

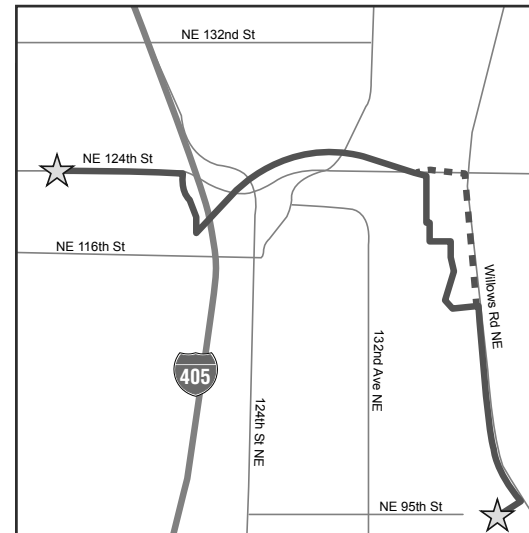
