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Natural gas relocation project near you

In conjunction with Seattle Department of Transportation's (SDOT) Center City Connector Streetcar project, PSE is working to relocate, reconfigure, and protect segments of natural gas pipeline in downtown Seattle to ensure continued public safety and customer reliability.

This work will be done in coordination with other utility relocation work in advance of Center City Connector Streetcar construction. PSE is working closely and proactively with SDOT and other jurisdictions and agencies to ensure the continued safety and reliability of our existing natural gas system in the area.

This project is required to accommodate Center City Connector Streetcar construction. For more information about SDOT's project, please visit **seattlestreetcar.org/centercity**.

What you can expect:

- What: Work entails relocation of intermediate pressure (IP) natural gas line and replacement and relocation of four service regulators, which convert the pressure of the system's natural gas so it can be used by customers.
- Where: Along S Jackson St and 1st Ave S in Pioneer Square. Please see map for details.
- Who: Crews from PSE and our contractor crews
- When: June September 2017 Sunday through Friday 7 p.m. – 5 a.m. and 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. (16 hour days) *Some additional weekend work during the day may be necessary.

Surface cuts, excavation and other typically noisy work will not occur between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m.

This work schedule will shorten the active construction window by up to 8 weeks.

Construction

We will work diligently to minimize impacts to neighbors, the environment, and traffic during construction.

- While construction is taking place, there will be some temporary traffic impacts, such as lane closures and limited access to on-street parking. It's our goal to minimize the impact of construction on local traffic and parking.
- Some night work may be required. If necessary, PSE will follow all applicable city requirements regarding acceptable noise levels at night.
- Some work may require a temporary disruption in service to natural gas customers. If a natural gas outage is necessary, a PSE representative will coordinate directly with affected customers.
