

- 1. The Prospective figures reflect the renewables that we have contracted to provide. Actual figures may vary according to resource availability. We will annually report to you before August 1 of next year in the form of a Historic Product Content Label the actual resource mix of the electricity you purchased. Historic figures reflect the power delivered to the PSE Green Power Program's customers in 2016.
- 2. New Renewables come from generation facilities that first began commercial operation within the past 15 years. This product includes generation from a facility that is approved under a strict set of criteria as repowered.
- 3. Eligible hydroelectric facilities are defined in the Green-e Energy National Standard (www.green-e.org/getcert-re-stan.shtml) and include facilities certified by the Low Impact Hydropower Institute (LIHI) (www.lowimpacthydro.org); and facilities comprised of a turbine in a pipeline or a turbine in an irrigation canal.

For comparison, the current average mix of resources supplying PSE includes: Hydroelectric (34%), Coal (31%), Natural Gas (29%), Wind (4%), Nuclear (1%), Other* (1%). *Biomass, Landfill Gas, Petroleum and Waste.
