The primary purposes of this filing are to: 1) clarify the original availability of Schedules 307, 317, and 327 to additional customers; 2) clarify language regarding estimation practices and the use of customer information; 3) clarify language regarding billing practice should a customer choose to terminate service under Schedules 307, 317, 324, or 327; and 4) extend the date that service will be available under Schedule 324 from October 1, 2023, to January 1, 2024. Additionally, this filing introduces new tariff schedule language in Schedules 307, 317, and 327 regarding bill protection and enabling technology, consistent with settlement terms and Commission orders. Both bill protection and enabling technology will be offered to a random selection of half of low-income participants in accordance with the Commission's Order Nos. 24/10.¹ These proposed clarifying tariff schedule changes will have no impact to charges in the tariff schedules.

The tariff sheets described herein reflect an issue date of September 14, 2023, and effective date of October 14, 2023. Posting of proposed tariff changes, as required by law and the Commission's rules and regulations, is being completed through web, telephone and mail access in accordance with WAC 480-100-193.
