**The Purpose of this Filing**

Puget Sound Energy (“PSE”) is filing this general rate case, which includes a multiyear rate plan to update its electric and natural gas rates and other selected tariff sheets. This filing requests an increase to tariff schedules to recover increased electric and gas revenue requirements as follows:

The impact of this filing is explained in greater detail in the Summary Document, enclosed herewith as **Addendum E**. An overview of the topics covered by each PSE witness is provided in the Third Exhibit to the Prefiled Direct Testimony of Matt Steuerwalt, Exh. MS-4, which is provided as part of this filing.

The multiyear rate plan that PSE proposes in this case complies with statutory requirements and carefully balances the interests of customers and PSE, consistent with legislative intent. Please

note that, with respect to the increase in the electric revenue requirement, PSE proposes to update its projection of the rate years' power costs during this proceeding. This update could result in an increase or decrease in the initial total requested electric net revenue change. In addition, once the Commission suspends this filing and the proceeding becomes adjudicative, the evidence developed and the ultimate findings and conclusions in the proceeding could result in electric and gas net revenue changes that are higher or lower than the amounts requested in this initial filing.

PSE has provided an electronic copy of **Addendum C**, which contains the above natural gas tariff sheets formatted with the coding required by WAC 480-80-105. PSE has also provided an electronic copy of **Addendum D**, which contains the above natural gas tariff sheets in legislative format as required by WAC 480-07-510(2).

Consistent with Order 06 in Docket UE-250537, PSE is including testimony, exhibits, and Schedule 95, Sheet 95-E.2, which reflects that effective February 1, 2027, the calculation of the share of the power cost imbalance under the Power Cost Adjustment Mechanism, including the full calendar year 2027 in the calculation, will reflect the complete elimination of the dead bands and the sharing bands.

Additionally, as explained in the Prefiled Testimony of Christopher T. Mickelson, Exh. CTM-1T, three electric adjusting tariff schedules other than those listed above will need to be reset simultaneously with the proposed changes to rates in this general rate case. While not filed as part of this case, one or more tariff sheets or attachments to tariff schedules from electric

Schedule 62 Substation and Related Equipment Capacity, electric Schedule 95A Federal Incentive Tracker, and electric Schedule 111 Greenhouse Gas Emissions Cap and Invest Adjustment will plan to be included in the final compliance filing with the effective date of new rates resulting from this rate case.

### **Additional Materials Submitted With This Filing**

PSE is filing prefiled direct testimony and exhibits in support of this general rate case. For the convenience of the Commission and persons interested in this case, a list of these testimonies and the exhibits supported by each witness is provided as **Addendum F**. In compliance with WAC 480-07-510, PSE will provide a total of five copies of the prefiled direct testimony and exhibits supporting this general rate case filing. PSE will provide these hard copies to the Commission consistent with Commission rules and arrangements made with the Records Center for sequencing of copies. These materials will be offered into the record at the appropriate time and should not be considered evidence until so entered.

In compliance with WAC 480-07-540(3)(g), PSE has provided the Report of Affiliated Interest Transactions as the Thirteenth Exhibit to the Prefiled Direct Testimony of Jamie L. Martin, Exh. JLM-14, and the Fourteenth Exhibit to the Prefiled Direct Testimony of Jamie L. Martin, Exh. JLM-15.

PSE has provided, as **Addendum H** to this cover letter, a document that sets forth Commission Staff's "Audit Guide – Initial Filing Assessment for Electric and Natural Gas Companies" requirements and PSE's explanation of how or where those requirements were met.

PSE has provided **Addendum I** to this filing, which is a completed adjustments list spreadsheet to assist the Commission with its review process.

### **Work Papers**

In compliance with WAC 480-07-510(4)(a), PSE will provide supporting electronic work papers to Commission Staff and Public Counsel by March 6, 2026, which is within five business days after the filing per the rules.

### **Notice of General Rate Case Filing**

Pursuant to WAC 480-07-510(5), PSE is serving copies of the Summary Documents in **Addendum E** to the persons listed on the Certificate of Service attached to this letter. PSE has provided a copy of the form of the cover letter and Certificate of Service for the parties noticed pursuant to WAC 480-07-510(5) in **Addendum G**.

PSE requests a timeline that allows for a rate effective date of January 29, 2027, with retroactive effect if necessary. Pursuant to WAC 480-100-194 and WAC 480-90-194, PSE agrees to

suspension of the proposed tariff filings and thus is not required to publish notice coincident with the date of this transmittal letter and filing. PSE agrees to waive the suspension hearing and requests that the Commission enter an order suspending these proposed changes for investigation and that a hearing date to take testimony from the public will be scheduled at the prehearing conference. Accordingly, PSE will provide public notice pursuant to WAC 480-100-197 and WAC 480-90-197. In accordance with WAC 480-100-193(1) and WAC 480-90-193(1), PSE will also post the proposed changes to its tariff sheets for public inspection and review on its website and will provide access via request by telephone or mail.

Please note that PSE has also simultaneously filed a Motion for a Protective Order Pursuant to WAC 480-07-420.

If, at the Customer's request, the meter is tested more frequently than once in twelve months and the results of the test show the meter to be either slow or registering within the allowable limits as reported by the Company, then the Customer shall pay a \$105.95 charge for the meter test of a single-phase meter and a \$292.65 charge for the meter test of all other meter types.
