Puget Sound Energy (“PSE” or “Company”) hereby submits in connection with Docket UE-260201 the following substitute electric tariff sheet for the tariff sheet that accompanied its March 30, 2026, filing under Advice No. 2026-08.

2nd Revision	Sheet No. 62-D	Substation and Related Equipment Capacity (Continued)
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The purpose of this substitute tariff filing is to add language to further clarify prerequisite requirements in Schedule 62, after consultation with Commission Staff. Like the original filing, the proposed tariff schedule language clarifications do not impact current customers, nor increase rates under this tariff schedule for applicants, nor do they represent a restriction of service. This filing does not represent an increase in revenues or change in rates or bills.

The tariff sheet described herein maintains the original issue date of March 30, 2026, and effective date of May 1, 2026. Notice and posting of proposed tariff changes, as required by law and the Commission’s rules and regulations, has been completed in accordance with WAC 480-100-193(1). Published notice to all electric customers was completed within 30 days of the originally proposed May 1, 2026, effective date.

Dear Executive Director Killip:

Pursuant to RCW 80.28.060 and WAC 480-80-101 and -105, please find enclosed for filing the following proposed revisions to the WN U-60, tariff for electric service of Puget Sound Energy (“PSE” or the “Company”):

2nd Revision	Sheet No. 62-D	Substation and Related Equipment Capacity (Continued)
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The purpose of this filing is to add language to clarify that the customer must first complete the financial and applicable requirements of Schedule 85 Line Extensions and Service Lines before utilizing the services of Schedule 62. This ensures proper sequencing of customer obligations and provides clear guidance on prerequisite requirements before a customer can request substation capacity services under Schedule 62.

In general, Schedule 62 makes substations and related equipment capacity available for use (“lease”) to PSE customers that take service at primary voltage under Schedules 26 and 31 or at high voltage under Schedules 46, 49, 449, and 459, subject to the availability and the conditions of Schedule 62. There are currently dozens of long-term lease customers taking this optional service. PSE’s service of leasing substation and related equipment capacity has been in existence for over 50 years.

The proposed tariff schedule language clarifications do not impact current customers, nor increase rates under this tariff schedule for applicants, nor do they constitute a restriction of service. This filing does not represent an increase in revenues or a change in rates or bills.

The tariff sheet described herein reflects an issue date of March 30, 2026 and an effective date of May 1, 2026. Posting of proposed tariff changes, as required by law and the Commission's rules and regulations, is being completed coincident with the date of this transmittal letter through web, telephone, and mail access in accordance with WAC 480-100-193(1). While not required, public notice to all customers, in accordance with the provisions of WAC 480-100-194, will be provided at least 30 days before the proposed May 1, 2026, effective date.


6. **TERMINATION CHARGE:** Subject to Schedules 449 and 459 of the Company's Electric Tariff G, (T)  
if Customer receives electric service from the Company under such schedule or if Customer  
receives electric service under any other schedule, following completion of meeting the terms and (C)  
conditions of Schedule 85 (unless the Customer entered into a Facilities Agreement prior to May 1, 2026), and Company builds or upgrades a substation and/or related equipment to provide (C)  
Schedule 62 service to Customer after July 1, 2015, upon expiration, termination or cancellation  
of the Facilities Agreement for any reason other than a breach or default by the Company,  
Customer shall be liable to the Company for the payment (in addition to any amounts owing  
under the Company's tariffs or any other agreement with Customer) of the following amounts  
("Termination Charges"): (i) the entire amount of the unrecovered capital costs and capitalized  
expenses incurred by the Company in connection with any of the equipment that, in the  
Company's determination, will not be used or usable by the Company in the Company's electric  
system following such expiration, termination or cancellation for providing electric service to  
Customers of the Company (including, without limitation, the Customer who entered into a  
Facilities Agreement with respect to the equipment), less any salvage value of such equipment,  
and (ii) the amount of all costs and expenses incurred by the Company in connection with any  
decommissioning, removal and refurbishment (but only to the extent refurbishment is necessary  
for use of the equipment on the Company's electric system) of such equipment by or for the  
Company. Within sixty (60) days following such expiration, termination or cancellation, the  
Company shall perform such evaluations and assessments as it may deem necessary or  
desirable to determine the feasibility of re-using or continuing to use such equipment for electric  
service to its retail Customers and the Company shall provide to Customer a statement  
containing the amounts referred to in clauses (i) and (ii) above, together with such supporting  
detail developed by the Company for its determination as Customer may reasonable request.  
Payment by Customer of the amounts set forth in the statement referred to above in this Section (T)  
6 shall be as specified in Schedule 80.
