**RE: Advice No. 2026-10
Puget Sound Energy’s Electric Tariff Revision**

Dear Executive Director Killip:

Pursuant to RCW 80.28.060, WAC 480-80-101 and -105 please find enclosed for filing the following proposed revisions to the WN U-60, tariff for electric service of Puget Sound Energy (“PSE” or “the Company”):

The purpose of this filing is to implement changes to rates under the established Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Mechanism, as provided in the Commission’s Order 10 in Dockets UE-220066 and UG-220067 (consolidated). Electric Schedule 142 adjusts rates, both up and down, for customers receiving service under Schedules 7, 7A, 8, 10, 11, 12, 24, 25, 26, 29, 31, 35, 43, 307, 327, 558 and special contracts (“Decoupled Customers”).

This update represents an electric revenue increase of \$29.0 million or 0.7 percent increase in overall customer bills for Schedule 142. However, Schedules 7A, 25, 26, 29, 35 and 43 will see decreases. A typical residential electric customer on Schedule 7 using 800 kWh per month would experience an increase of \$1.80 or 1.13 percent. When utilizing actual revenues as stated in the Company's most recent Commission Basis Report, the increase of \$29.0 million represents an average increase of 0.86 percent.

Bill assistance programs such as PSE’s Bill Discount Rate, PSE Home Energy Lifeline Program

(“HELP”), the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (“LIHEAP”), and the Salvation Army Warm Home Fund are available to qualified customers who need help with their energy bills. PSE customers can go online to pse.com/assistance or call 1-888-225-5773 to learn if they are eligible. Payment plans are also available.

The tariff sheet described herein reflects an issue date of April 1, 2026, and an effective date of May 1, 2026. Posting of proposed tariff changes, as required by WAC 480-100-193, is being accomplished on the PSE web site coincident with the date of this transmittal letter. Notice to the public under the provisions of WAC 480-100-194 will be provided within 30 days of the requested May 1, 2026, effective date.
