**RE: Advice No. 2026-17
Puget Sound Energy’s Natural Gas Tariff Revision**

Dear Executive Director Killip:

Pursuant to RCW 80.28.060 and WAC 480-80-101 and -105, please find enclosed for filing the following proposed revisions to the WN U-2, tariff for natural gas service of Puget Sound Energy (“PSE” or the “Company”):

The purpose of this filing is to implement changes to rates under the Property Tax Tracker mechanism, as provided in the Commission’s Order 07 (Final Order Granting Petition) in Dockets UE-121697 and UG-121705 (consolidated) which was combined with the Commission’s Order 07 (Final Order Authorizing Rates) in Dockets UE-130137 and UG-130138 (consolidated) (“Order 07”) and the Commission’s Final Order Settlement Stipulation and Agreement in Dockets UE-220066, UG-220067 and UG-210918 (consolidated). Natural Gas Supplemental Schedule 140 is filed annually to recover property tax costs in the current year and true up rates and property tax costs from the prior year.

This update represents a revenue requirement increase of \$1.12 million or 0.11 percent increase in overall customer bills. A typical residential customer on Schedule 23 using 64 therms per month would experience a \$0.13 increase in their monthly bill or 0.12 percent. When utilizing actual revenues as stated in the Company’s most recent Commission Basis Report, the increase of \$1.12 million represents an average increase of 0.09 percent.

Bill assistance programs such as PSE’s Bill Discount Rate (“BDR”), PSE Home Energy Lifeline Program (“HELP”), the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (“LIHEAP”), Past-due Bill Forgiveness (an Arrearage Management Plan which launched in October 2025), and the Salvation Army Warm Home Fund (“WHF”) are available to qualified customers who need help with their energy bills. PSE customers can go to pse.com/assistance or call 1-888-225-5773 to learn if they are eligible. Payment plans are also available.


