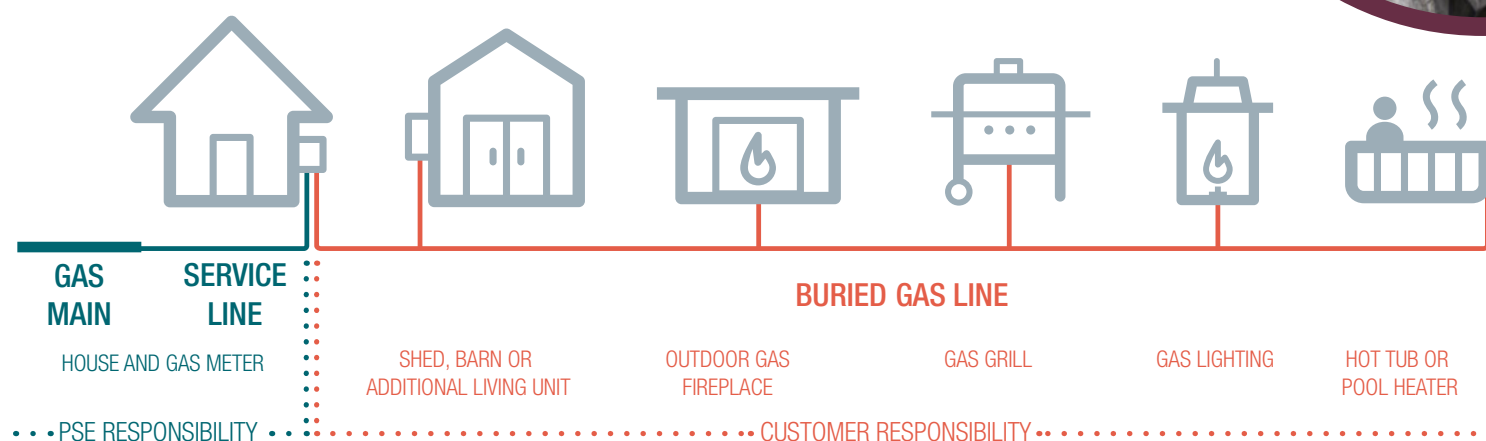

Record sockeye return marks conservation milestone

Last year, Puget Sound Energy, tribal partners, and state officials celebrated a historic achievement: nearly 92,000 sockeye salmon returned to spawn in the Skagit River system in 2025. This marks a dramatic recovery from just 99 fish in the mid-1980s, thanks to a 21-year collaborative effort involving fish passage improvements, hatchery expansion, and habitat restoration. 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Public comment hearing for Puget Sound Energy's electric Power Cost Adjustment Mechanism calculation



On July 8, 2025, in Docket UE-250537, Puget Sound Energy (PSE) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) proposed revisions to its electric WN U-60, Tariff G, Schedule 95 Power Cost Adjustment Clause.

The filing requests a change to the method of calculation of future rates set under Schedule 95 by eliminating the dead band (where PSE retains or absorbs the difference between forecasted and actual power costs) and sharing bands (a defined financial range where the utility and its customers share in the differences between forecasted and actual power costs) from its power cost adjustment mechanism (PCAM).

PSE's purpose in filing this request is to: (1) streamline its PCAM operations; (2) better align the Company's PCAM with widely accepted industry standards; (3) improve the management and control of power costs and bands that contribute to financial obstacles; and (4) demonstrate to the UTC that PCAM bands are contrary to clean energy policies and result in increasing utility service costs for customers.

Under the proposed tariff revisions, the new language provides that on December 31, 2025, the calculation of the share of the power cost imbalance under the PCAM will reflect the complete elimination of the dead bands and the sharing bands that were required in Dockets UE-011570 (12th Supplemental Order, November 26, 2001) and UE-130617 (Order 11, August 7, 2015). There are no bill or rate impacts included with this filing.

The UTC will review the filing and has the authority to approve, reject, or approve with conditions, PSE's electric Power Cost Adjustment Mechanism.
